GOPHER & SCOOTER ROAD SAFETY

If there is no footpath you should travel on the <u>right</u> hand side of the road facing the oncoming traffic and be as near to the curb or gutter



Entrance Upgrade for Boort

Member for Swan Hill, Peter Walsh, announced a major \$400,000 project to enhance and develop the entrance to the town.

Thanks to a \$300,000 Victorian Government funding injection the project will develop amenities at the town's eastern entrance through the provision of a visitor's shelter, new shared-use pathways to link facilities with

parking, improved boat-ramp access and safety fences at the site's playgrounds.

"The development will improve vehicle and pedestrian access to the popular lakeside precinct and

caravan park and provide a meeting place for tourists travelling in the Loddon Shire to stop and stretch their legs."

"Not only will the project improve Boort's image as a top visitor destination – but it will make it an easier and safer place to access for both vehicles and pedestrians," he said.

Minster Walsh said tourism was a key economic driver for the region with activity centered on the Lake Boort wetlands.

"This upgrade is a joint initiative between Loddon Shire Council and Boort Development Committee and will provide the infrastructure and facilities that the town needs to attract investment and boost local businesses," Mr Walsh said.

VicRoads, Powercor Australia and Goulburn Murray Water have also contributed to preliminary supporting infrastructure that will enable the project which aligns with the Southern Loddon Mallee Regional Strategic Plan to proceed.

Plea to horse owners

Council's local laws staff have cautioned horse owners in the Shire to keep an eye on the welfare of their animals, as late winter feed supplies continue to dwindle.

The Department of Environment and Primary Industries says a horse needs at least 1.5 per cent of its bodyweight in fibre from sources such as hay or pasture each day – for a 500kg horse, that's 7.5kg daily.

The department's Bureau of Animal Welfare says the hay used must be suitable for horses and that new owners should not be lulled into a false sense of security when winter rains lead to paddocks tinged with green shoots. Owners must be aware of what has been termed "the green drought illusion", where new, green pastures may not in fact contain enough feed and nutrition to meet horses' needs and supplementary feed may still be required. Owners have a legal responsibility to ensure their horses do not starve or become distressed at any time, including during cold winter conditions when feed is scarce.

Council staff are considering inspecting premises where horses are kept to check on such potential concerns as appropriate shelter, food availability, food storage and any effect on surrounding amenity.

Subaru Cycle tour visits Boort

Residents of Boort and Pyramid Hill have the chance to leave a lasting impression when waves of riders pass through their towns next month on their way to Cohuna.

The cyclists will be competing in a day-long 136km road race on **Thursday 5 September** as part of the six-day Tour of the Murray River. The seven-stage tour, which starts in Mildura on Tuesday 3 September and ends in Yarrawonga the following Sunday, includes five road races of up to 163km and two criterium events. On the Thursday, riders will leave Kerang and are expected **to pass through Boort around 11:00 a.m.** and Pyramid Hill near noon before reaching the finishing line at Cohuna.

Cycling Australia estimates there will be around 350 riders, 320 support personnel and a further 350 officials, volunteers, media people and spectators.

The event is to be broadcast on SBS Television and via the Subaru NRS website. This is a chance for the township to make a good impression on the visitors

Boort District Health Transport Services.

BDH Home and Community Care Services provide a local transport service for shopping/ paying bills.

This service operates using the hospital car each Friday morning. The car is driven by a volunteer driver and involves a fee of \$3-00. The client specifies pick up times and is transported down the street and home by the volunteer driver.

Arts, Culture & Environment Centre (ACE) plan open for community input

You may not have heard much recently about the proposed Boort ACE (Arts, Culture and Environment Centre), but we've been planning, drawing and number-crunching, and have produced a dynamic business plan - <u>and now we want community comment</u> <u>and input – for, against and on the fence, all welcome.</u>

New site

The proposed site for the Centre is the vacant block on Godfrey Street between the Boort Resource & Information Centre (BRIC) and the kindergarten, attached to BRIC and sharing BRIC entrance and staff.

Plans for ACE have been developing over the past six years, and during that time several sites have been considered, including beside Little Lake Boort, "Chinaman's block" (east of the caravan park, between the two lakes), the former "Catholic block" (opposite the caravan park entrance), and the former primary school (King St).

The current attached-to-BRIC site means the Centre is on the highway, overlooks Little Lake Boort, and is within walking distance of the Godfrey Street shops and the Historical Society's Museum, so it ticks all those boxes. The economics

The most crucial box is economics, and as BRIC is staffed Monday to Friday, it makes economic sense for the Centre to part-fund BRIC staff to share those hours, and increase staff hours.

The BRIC site also has water, electricity, phone, internet and parking that can be expanded – rather than built from scratch – for the Centre.



The exhibitions

The theme of the Centre will be **shared European-Indigenous history and culture**, in particular, the unique relationship between the Boort Dja Dja Wurrung and early European settlers John Hunter Kerr and the Godfrey brothers, who leased the 89,000 acre 'Fernihurst' station in 1849.

The main exhibitions in the centre will include:

- the historic black and white photos taken by John Hunter Kerr around the Boort district from 1849, which include what are believed to be the first photos of Aborigines in Australia;
- Aboriginal artefacts gathered locally, plus items from Kerr's extraordinary collection from the Boort district that were
 exhibited at *Exposition Universelle* in Paris in 1855 and are currently held at the British Museum, including a famous bark
 etched painting and ceremonial emu headdress;
- the artwork of Henry Godfrey, whose sketches and water colours of the Boort district are of national significance, and have never been permanently displayed and recognised;
- excerpts from Frederick Godfrey's diary, which so vividly depicts living conditions of the early white settlers and their relationships with the Aborigines of the Loddon Plains.

ACE will also be an **activity and educational centre** for visiting school groups, and outside will display spanner sculptures by John Piccoli. The plan is also for the centre to be a **hub for tours** of the scarred trees, the wetlands, and for Indigenous activities and tours.

Something new

Most of these ideas have been in the plan since the public meeting in August 2010, but the questions were *where and how could it operate economically*.

The answers became clearer when Barry Kennedy presented drawings (site plan) in February for ACE to be built next to BRIC, and two newcomers to Boort joined the Development Committee: Boort District School Principal Andrew Whatley and businessman Rod Poxon, who grew up in Boort and returned recently when his wife Vicki took over as CEO of Boort District Health.

Andrew helped us develop the idea that the Centre, with its associated educational activities, can be a premier destination of school groups to visit, from all over the State.

Rod, with his experience in business, showed that ACE could be economical if it was developed in stages. He prepared a proper business plan with establishment costs and a budget that covers the first eight years of operating. Rod showed that ACE could break-even at year 3, after which time other stages and activities could be added or developed.

Public comment


Rod's business plan was formally presented to the Loddon Shire by Development Committee President Barry Barnes on 16 August and has since been sent also to the Dja Dja Wurrung Boort Clan and Regional Arts Victoria for further comment and input.

The Development Committee is seeking community comment.

Scott Lanyon Talks to Probus

Guest Speaker at the Probus Club of Boort & District was Scott Lanyon (son of Dorothy & Norman). He is an Engineer with BAE Systems in the Australian Defence Industry – it has a big budget, and everything is built very well for our defence forces. Scott is also Chairman of the Australian Centre for Mission Aviation at Coldstream.

He acknowledged Malcolm Cousland as an exceptional teacher of physics when he was a student at Boort High School.

Scott opened with a story: "The USS Stark ship ran aground in the Falklands. There were 100's of sailors on the ship. Argentine aircraft fired on them with exocet missiles which travel at several times the speed of sound. After the initial explosion, the aluminium superstructure of the ship melted in the heat from the fire and the plastic sheaths on cables were very toxic when it burned." Many sailors died.

The world recognised the need to protect our sailors. "The Brits designed a radio payload to go under a helicopter and it would drag the missile away from the ship. It was terrifying for the chopper pilot. Prince Andrew was one of these. DSTO had developed a hovering rocket - Scott's team joined two systems together, so they could be put on a ship and at a minute's notice deployed against the incoming missile. "We did trials in the desert in South Australia and the system proved very effective".

The system became known as the NULKA Active Missile Decoy. Nulka is now used on high value ships such as the LHD in Williamstown and Aircraft carriers. Nulka systems are built in Mulwala, Victoria, and have been a great success for Australian industry. They are sold to the Royal Australian Navy and the US Navy. In the early stage of Nulka production the Australians had some defence equipment which the Americans did not - it was a proud moment.

In another project, Scott explained how Australia had procured the F/A18 Hornets at high cost, but a trainer was needed. The Royal Australian Airforce (RAAF) bought the Hawk 128 from the United Kingdom. Scott's team built a flight simulator for the Hawk, and it was fitted out with F18 controls. The system operates in a room with projectors and provides a low risk training environment for Hawk 128 pilots who go on to become F/A18 pilots. The system was built in Australia then sold back to the United Kingdom.

Scott went on to work on the Advanced Early Warning and Control aircraft (AEW&C). Six were built for the Australian Government RAAF and operated by the RAAF. – Project cost approximately \$4 billion. The aircraft are used up and down the west coast of Australia for surveillance. It's a Boeing 737 and has radar on top which can track hundreds of different sea, land and airborne objects – "they can see everything within hundreds of miles."

Scott is currently working on a Navy ship at Williamstown Dockyard where BAE Systems are fitting the superstructure and preparing for sea trials. "The ship can carry 2,000 people and a lot of equipment. They have to have it ready for the cyclone season late 2014. The ship can store helicopters, landing craft and vehicles – it can carry the whole fleet. It is very manoeuvrable for such a big ship as it's 'pods' (steering gear) under the ship can push forward, backwards and sideways. The ship is 200 metres long and weighs 27,000 tonnes. They are making two of these ships at Williamstown – the "Canberra" and the "Adelaide". It will be over \$2 billion for the two. Williamstown dockyards employs 1,000 people, so that is 1,000 families involved. Scott showed us a video of much of this amazing equipment in action. It was just incredible and gives us great confidence in the strength of the Australian Defence Force.

Since the Wedgetail project where Scott was an Engineering Manager he was made a Fellow of the Institute of Engineers and is now also Chairman of the Australian Centre for Mission Aviation (ACMA).

ACMA train pilots and engineers for MAF – who carry medical and other supplies to remote places including Arnhem land, New Guinea Highlands and Timor. They are training pilots and engineers at Coldstream for all of this – 8 flight students and up to 10 engineering students. It is a Christian Fellowship helping people who otherwise would suffer or die.

Scott would love to hear from any Boort students in the future who are keen to become pilots or aviation engineers.
